Canal du Midi: With its 328 works of art and a unique landscape shaped by man, the canal du Midi is a true gem boasting an outstanding natural and built heritage. The technical feat of its excavation in the 17th century is a remarkable civil engineering achievement. This is why it has been listed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site since 1996. A genuine link between the lands it passes through, the canal bears witness to successive eras and leaves an astonishingly diverse legacy of intangible heritage. Discover the history of the canal du Midi through anecdotes and by visiting and experiencing the must-see sites along the waterside!

History: Designed in the 17th century by the engineer Pierre-Paul Riquet at Louis XIV's request and inaugurated in 1681, the canal du Midi runs for 240 kilometres and connects Toulouse to Sète, on the shores of the

Mediterranean. An exceptional work of art, considered to be the largest construction site at the time (thousands of workers at work for 14 years), the canal du Midi opened a prosperous page in the history of river trade in the south of France by allowing goods, wheat, to pass from the Mediterranean to the Atlantic without going around the Iberian Peninsula since the Garonne was then navigable downstream from Toulouse to Bordeaux. Nowadays, with the canal de Garonne, cruise ships no longer sail on the river to Langon (on the outskirts of Bordeaux).

Carcassonne: Visit the Medieval City of Carcassonne - WEB. Go by foot or take a taxi.

Step into a fairytale: You'll see it appear in the distance like a vision, crowning a hill in the midst of the vineyards. Carcassonne, its 52 towers and 3km long double city wall encapsulates how everyone imagines a medieval town. UNESCO listed it in 1997 and you're invited to the party to celebrate its 1000 years of military architecture. Enter through the Narbonne gate.

Walk around the town, soak up the buzzing restaurants and boutiques, stop in the 12th century **count's château** built by the Trencavels and visit **Saint-Nazaire Basilica**.

Meeting at the Cité Tourist Office, at the entrance to the Medieval City, 21 Rue Cros Mayrevieille, 11000 Carcassonne with Séverine Jung for a visit of the outer fortifications of the City, the streets and the Basilica of Saint Nazaire with a tour guide. Trèbes: If the sailing schedule allows visits:

Marseillette: The village sits on a rocky outcrop between the River Aude and the Canal du Midi. Research suggests that the village was inhabited as far back as 2000 BC, during the Bronze Age, under the name of Villacano.

16h-19h Marseillette → Puichéric : 8 locks – 2h40

Puichéric: Situated in the heart of the Aude department, between Carcassonne and Narbonne, Puichéric, known as "The Venice of the Minervois", is a commune crossed by three rivers: the Canal du Midi, the Aude and the Rigole. Its main activity is wine growing.

On the way, at **La Redorte**, don't miss the "Epanchoir de l'Argent Double", a listed historic monument. The Vauban's design construction begun in 1677 and was completed in 1694, it allows the canal du Midi to drain off its overflow of water into the river Argent-Double.

Le Somail: Visit of Le Somail and the famous library.

- The village: In the Minervois region, the hamlet of Le Somail is like a little paradise, and even today it's still steeped in the atmosphere of the 17th century. A rich history, but a place that's not stuck in the past. A little history: The Canal du Midi was completed in 1682. The port of Le Somail was built as a mooring place (hence the name "Somail", which comes from the Old French word for "sleep"). For travellers on mail boats, it was an important rest stop between Toulouse and Sète.

Begin sailing Le Somail → Capestang: 0 locks – 3h

On the way, don't miss the lowest bridge along the Canal du Midi

14h-15h30

Capestang → Tunnel de Malpas – Colombiers: 0 locks – 1h30

- Capestang, literally the "cap de l'étang" / "cape of the pond", owes its name to its strategic position at the head of an ancient lagoon. Don't miss out on its exceptional heritage: first and foremost, the collegiate church of Saint-Etienne, as beautiful as it is imposing, but also the château and its 15th-century painted ceiling.
- Tunnel de Malpas: The Malpas tunnel is the one and only tunnel on the entire length of the Canal du Midi, between Toulouse and Marseillan. Passing under the hill of Ensérune, it is the symbol of Pierre-Paul Riquet's obstinacy. At this point, the canal was facing the hill. How was the canal to be built? Tempers flared. And a veritable cabal was organised: horsemen rode to Paris to ask Jean-Baptiste Colbert (minister of finances od Louis XIV) to intervene. Against all the odds, in just eight days a test gallery was cut through the crumbly sandstone of the hill and secured by a cemented vault. Pierre-Paul Riquet had won, and the road to Béziers was open.

• **Colombiers**: is a charming little town where life is good. The gentle sunshine gently bathes its river port on the Canal du Midi. The intimacy and serenity of the setting literally seduce you from the moment you arrive. This feeling of well-being will stay with you all day, whether you're cruising on the Canal or strolling through the town centre.

If the sailing schedule allows visit: **Discover the church of Saint-Sylvestre and Sainte-Colombe**: As soon as you arrive in the historic heart of the village, you'll quickly realise that Colombiers has been around for centuries. Agriculture, winegrowing: even today, local life is dedicated to the land.

Surprisingly, there are also traces of the Visigoth people. Enter the church. The earliest traces of a religious building date back to the early Christian period. What a surprise! It's unusual and good to know. The village also has a small Romanesque church that has withstood various invasions. It is still intact. A pleasure to behold!

07h-08h Breakfast on board

08h Go through the Fonseranes locks: 9 locks

• The 9 locks of Fonséranes: This spectacular water staircase, a major structure on the Canal du Midi, was Pierre-Paul Riquet's gift to his hometown. L'Octuple (8 locks, 9 successive basins), built between 1676 and 1680, spans a height difference of 21.50 m over a length of 300 m. The refurbished and modernised site reopened to the public on 1 July 2017. Traditional buildings such as the Coche d'eau - now the Maison du Site, with Tourist Office, screening room for an exceptional film, shop and panoramic restaurant - and the lock-keeper's house have survived to this day.

Fonseranes → Béziers: 2 locks 40 mn

• **Béziers**: Crossed by the River Orb, surrounded by the Mediterranean Sea and the Languedoc wine-growing plain, Béziers will win you over. Experience a gentle journey through time: from Roman times with its ancient amphitheater and arenas, to the memory of medieval villages and the Albigensian Crusade, its Saint Nazaire cathedral, and Allées Paul Riquet.

• OIn Béziers, you will cross the Orb River by the beautiful canal bridge which enables boats on the Canal to cross the river easily.

Béziers → **Port Cassafières**: 3 locks – 2h30

• Port Cassafières / Portiragnes:

Between the sea and the Garrigue, stroll through the narrow streets of this charming southern village. Discover its old stones and its 12th-century church in the company of Arnaud, guide and lecturer.
