With over 60 hiking trails, lasting from 10 minutes to several hours, the Sidobre is one of the most remarkable natural sites in the Tarn. It's a 120km² granite island, making it a geological exception. Sidobre granite is an exceptional material that has been used for the pavements of the Champs Elysées, the Shanghai World Trade Centre and Frankfurt airport.

Short hike to discover the Peyro Clabado, the Sentier des Merveilles and Lac du Merle.

You'll discover the heritage of Castres, a Town of Art and History, with its town houses, its Goya Museum and its emblematic colourful houses on the River Agout, which have earned it the nickname of the little Venice of the South.

Meeting at the Pierre Fabre stadium for the captain's training session: interviews with Gérard Cholley, Matthias Rolland and Tom Staniforth

Castres Olympique's stadium was christened the Stade Pierre Fabre on Saturday 9 September 2017, when they hosted MHR. For 30 years, the unwavering support of Pierre Fabre and his group has enabled the OC to return to the elite and to be one of the few French clubs to remain there permanently since 1990. The club is proud to play in a stadium bearing the name of a man without whom it would never have been able to reach its current level and try to maintain it. A man who left his mark on the city of Castres and contributed to its development.

*The stadium was formerly known as the Pierre-Antoine stadium in memory of the illustrious player, who was 2nd row in the team that won the French championship in 1949 and 1950. He was twice voted best player of the championship and was originally from Gaillac.

He died suddenly in the dressing room after a match against Montréjeau on 30 September 1956, aged 35 at the time.

At 130 metres long, the Passerelle de Mazamet is one of only 3 Himalayan footbridges in France. Overlooking the Arnette valley from a height of 70 metres, it links the town of Mazamet with the ancient castrum of Hautpoul. It is equipped with a via ferrata and 3 zip lines. For the past year, the footbridge has been illuminated every evening until 2am. In summer, night-time walks are organised on the footbridge, as well as torch-lit walks through the village of Hautpoul.
